Clatsop CASA promotes and supports quality volunteer representation for children, and assists CASA volunteers as they advocate for children to achieve permanency in safe, nurturing homes.

Clatsop CASA is also dedicated to participating in community collaborations to enhance service delivery systems and strengthen family functioning in order to encourage permanent homes for every child in our community.

Volunteer Spotlight

Jody grew up in the suburbs of Chicago before her family moved to lowa, a wonderful place to raise children. While visiting, they discovered the Oregon Coast and fell in love with the area. Jody and her husband decided to retire early and they found just the right spot on the North Coast to call home.

Reading, walking on the beach, volunteering at the food pantry in Gearhart, and working on helping women with scholarship opportunities are just a few of the things Jody does in her spare time. She was a teacher for 27 years and has taught students from every continent except for Antarctica.

While Jody's daughter was in law school in Portland she heard a presentation from CASA and thought that her mom would be a perfect fit. She encouraged Jody to become a volunteer. Jody kept CASA on her radar for some time and eventually did the training and made the commitment to become a CASA volunteer.

Jody has found the CASA work to be rewarding, and she likes to challenge herself by stepping outside of her comfort zone. The biggest highlight for Jody has been the chance to get to know the children and to understand their needs so that she can advocate on their behalf. She says that her biggest struggle as a CASA is "feeling that children are unhappy and struggling with decisions made by adults that may or may not be in their best interest." Her role as a CASA allows for her to be a voice for children in the foster care system and to speak on their behalf.

We are grateful for Jody and all our volunteers whose service to children continues to make a big difference in their lives!

Becoming a CASA

CASA volunteers are ordinary people doing extraordinary things; each one of them dedicates a few hours a month to be an advocate for a child in foster care, willing to evaluate needs, investigate solutions, and be a voice for a child.

To become a CASA, our volunteers train for over 30 hours. They learn about child welfare law, community resources, and the many circumstances that lead to children entering foster care.

At the end of training, CASAs are sworn in at the Clatsop County Circuit Court, before accepting their first case.




Jody Heverly CASA Volunteer since 2014
